A new Sensory Garden being planted at Union Village is a special initiative made possible by the leadership and generosity of longtime friend of the Home and Master Gardener, Keith Cardwell of Foley.

With the partnership of Jacob Turner, the Regional Extension Agent for Central/East Central Alabama with the Auburn University Cooperative Extension, and the Talladega Master Gardeners Interns Class, this unique garden is designed to engage all five senses—sight, sound, smell, touch, and taste. The goal is to create an inclusive space for the individuals served by PHFC (Presbyterian Home for Children) and AIDB through Union Village who are deaf, blind, deafblind, or multidisabled.

This garden located at the bus stop next to Jordan Cottage, allows them to experience the therapeutic and enriching benefits of nature with a winding crushed stone path and raised plant beds. Each plant was thoughtfully selected for its sensory properties, offering a holistic experience in this serene environment.

The thoughtfully designed space offers a variety of experiences for visitors with or without disabilities. From colorful plants and fragrant flowers to wind chimes and water features, every element is intended to excite the senses and encourage mindfulness. For those with vision impairments, plants will be clustered for easier sight recognition, while ornamental grasses will add auditory depth through the sounds of rustling leaves. Visitors are encouraged to touch soft petals, feel rough bark and experience the overall serenity of this thoughtful landscape.

The garden is a passion project for Cardwell, who retired as minister of Swift Presbyterian Church in Foley and uses his free time to enjoy gardening. Born and raised in nearby Goodwater, Cardwell has been a strong supporter of the Home for over 30 years.

January Speaker by Charlotte Hamm

"I took all the clippings from my favorite new plant to the greenhouse, and Dolores said, NO! I wonder why?" Come to the January meeting to answer this and many more questions about our greenhouse propagation.

Dr. Jeremy Pickens, of the Ornamental Horticulture Research Center in Mobile, will speak on plant propagation and plant patent laws. You may remember him as one of our breakout speakers at the AMGA conference we held here in April. He is an Auburn University graduate, where he earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in horticulture, and a doctorate focused on aquaculture. Dr. Pickens is an Assistant Extension Professor, works in Extension programming, and does applied research for the nursery and greenhouse industry. He has responsibilities in ornamental and horticulture, specialty crops, greenhouse vegetables, as well as Christmas trees.

In all these research and extension responsibilities, he is working closely with extension agents and commercial producers across the state. We look forward to Dr. Pickens sharing his expertise in greenhouse propagation.


